The Fairfax Resolves Chapter was recognized as the Best Chapter in the United States at the 2018 National Congress in Houston, TX in July. The chapter made a clean sweep of the top three national awards for chapters of 100-199 members, winning the Liberty Bell Americanism Award, the President General's Activities Award and the President General's Cup. The awards were presented to the chapter by President General Larry Guzy for having the most complete program of activities in 2017.

PAST FAIRFAX RESOLVES CHAPTER PRESIDENT JOHN SINKS EARNS MINUTEMAN AWARD

Past Fairfax Resolves Chapter President John Sinks was presented the National Minuteman Award at the 2018 National Congress. The Minuteman Award is the highest award presented to a Compatriot for active and distinguished service rendered to the National Society. Sinks is the second past chapter president to earn this prestigious award, joining Larry McKinley.

Sinks served as chapter President in 1985-86 and as Virginia Society President in 1994-95. He has served the National Society as Genealogist General for four terms and as a Vice President General. He has served on numerous national committees. Sinks is a first line sponsor on sixty one new members. He has attended eleven National Congresses and eighteen National Leadership Meetings. He is currently a member of the District of Columbia Society.

The National Society selects no more than six Compatriots for the award each year. There were six members in the Class of 2018.

The American Revolution: A World War

Open June 26, 2018 - July 9, 2019

Exhibit at the Smithsonian Museum of American History presents the Revolution in its global context with a focus on France and Spain. Two paintings of the Siege and Surrender of Yorktown, both painted in 1786, and a Peale portrait of Washington, painted in 1780–1782, are united for the first time in a national museum since they were displayed together in the 1700s in Rochambeau's home. Other artifacts include a pistol given to Washington by General Braddock during the Seven Years War; a cannon used at Yorktown, Washington's Yorktown siege map drawn after the conflict; a ship model of Adm. de Grasse's Ville de Paris, which led the French fleet that blocked British ships; and memorabilia from Lafayette's visit to the U.S. for the 50th anniversary of Independence.

President Ken Bonner welcomed new member James Kendley at the Spring chapter luncheon at Gadsby's Tavern in Alexandria on May 12, 2018.



Board of Managers Recommends Dues Increase

The Fairfax Resolves Board of Managers, at its April 2018 meeting, recommended an increase in the chapter's membership dues to take effect in 2019. The Board recommends that the chapter increase dues from \$86.00 to \$95.00 per year, which includes chapter, state and national dues. This recommendation was brought before the chapter at its Spring luncheon at Gadsby's Tavern. Due to the success of our programs, the chapter has ran a deficit to its budget the past couple of years. This has required the chapter to tap our reserve to cover operating costs. Examples include providing awards and certificates for our poster contest, which has grown to 235 posters from 15 schools, and our Eagle Scout program, which has grown to 35 Eagles from 5 troops. The success of our programs was reflected in the Fairfax Resolves being named the Best Chapter in the U.S. for 2017-18.
