# **Crossing of the Dan**

It was a chilly Saturday morning as the color guard marched from The Prizery across the street to Constitution Square for the closing ceremony honoring ancestors who served in the American Revolution, an event memorializing the 237th Anniversary of the Crossing of the Dan.

Understanding the importance of having children involved was Jeff Thomas of the Fairfax Resolves Chapter who participated in the color guard with his 11-year-old son, Justin.

It's a real, tangible piece of history that's he's able to share with his son. "I think it's very important that these kind of events take place in communities to see the celebration of heritage and to be reminded of our freedoms and how they came to be," said Thomas.

Also marching in the color guard was Richard Abbott of Leesburg, and supporting him in colonial attire was his wife. This was the second year they had participated in the event, and they said, "It's a lovely event, and we enjoyed it so much we want to come back next year."

Now in their retirement, the couple enjoys participating in historical events two to three times a year, and they called the Crossing of the Dan "something special."

"We really enjoy the pageantry of it all with the color guard and the wreath laying, and of course, the Brunswick stew," the two agreed.

Her husband added, "My ancestors fought in the revolution, and I try to honor them this way."

## Compatriot Dioquino Inducted Into Society of the Cincinnati



On February 17th, Compatriot Tim Dioquino, accompanied by his wife Judy, was inducted into The Society of the Cincinnati of Maryland at the Maryland Club in Baltimore, MD to represent his fifth great grandfather Brigadier General Mordecai Gist who was an Original Member and their first Vice President on November 21, 1783.

The members of the Society share a personal connection to the officers in the Continental and French service who secured the independence of the United States. With a current membership of over 3900, they also share a personal tie as fellow members of the oldest hereditary society in the United States. In most cases, only one descendant of a qualified officer of their native state can be a hereditary member of the Society.

As a Major, Mordecai Gist led the now legendary Maryland 400 of the First Maryland Regiment at the Battle of Brooklyn (Long Island) who repeatedly charged a numerically superior British force in one of the first engagements of the Revolutionary War. While sustaining heavy casualties on August 27, 1776, his delaying action allowed General Washington to successfully evacuate the bulk of his troops to Manhattan to continue fighting in the New York and New Jersey campaigns. Congratulations Compatriot Dioquino for representing your propositus and our Chapter!

# **Chapter Orations**




The chapter orations contest was held in January at Falcon's Landing. There were four participants, all hailing from Bishop O'Connell High School.


Taking part in the presentation were other members of the chapter who have received the War or Military Service Medal including Woody Bentley, Tim Dioquino and Rick Garlick.


## Give Me Liberty or Give Me Death


